## **General Updates and Information**

Dear Everyone

May usually brings the sunshine so fingers crossed that it will continue to shine. Due to the unpredictability of the weather could we please remind all families to ensure the children have light waterproof coats for outside activities at all times.



We are pleased to report that for the 12th year running we are over subscribed for the next academic year in the Reception Classes. Could we please ask if any families are due to be moving at the end of the academic year that they let the school office know so that families on our waiting lists are able to be offered a place.

Next week children of Year 6 will be sitting the National Curriculum SAT assessments. The tests will be given to the children in a supportive environment which will enable all the children to demonstrate their many talents. Outcomes of the assessment tests will be shared with individual families in the pupils end of year reports. Year 2 no longer sit SATs although they will carry out assessments in line with other children across the school. This will enable the school to identify further areas of learning and support.

#### **School Improvement and Development**

A big thank you to everyone who has completed the School Survey in preparation for our next Ofsted visit. We will share the results in the next newsletter.

Currently across the school we are working with children and families on acceptable behaviours in school. If you would like to read the Behaviour Policy of the school you can do so here on our website link <a href="here">here</a>. The school is very clear that respectful behaviour by children, staff and families is required at all times. We also have a zero tolerance to physical violence and racist behaviour and are working tirelessly to ensure that this is the case. Instances of this nature are uncommon occurrences but do occur and the school behaviour policy and that of the West Sussex reporting requirements will be adhered to at all times. All incidents of unacceptable behaviour are recorded and shared with families as they occur. Children of the school are encouraged to report at all times any concerns to a trusted adult or a member of staff who is working with them. If concerns are not shared it is very difficult to address things that are not known.



All our assemblies are focusing on the behaviour policy to ensure that all children have strategies to seek help for their individual concerns. We would appreciate if families could encourage their children to ensure that any incidents are reported to the school adults as and when things occur. Thank you.

#### Staffing Update

The school is currently reviewing staffing ready for the new academic year and will be making a number of staffing decisions in the coming weeks. These will be shared with everyone once the class arrangements for 2024-2025 have been finalised.

This half term we have welcomed Ms Connelly to the school and she will be working 3 days a week to support children as a Learning Mentor and LSA. The work she will carry out will involve supporting a range of different initiatives to support individuals and groups across the school.

## Transition— Years 6, 2 and R (EYFS)


