
#### **Positive Feedback from Local Authority Visit**


#### **Mathematics**

## New Reading Framework in KS2

This term, we have introduced a new approach to teaching reading in Key Stage 2, focusing on fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary development. Routed in the concept of 'The Bridge of Fluency', strategies such as echo reading, repeated reading, and vocabulary exploration are at the heart of this new framework.



Although it's still early days, the impact is already visible, with pupils engaging deeply with texts, some seeking out the rest of the text in the library and improving their reading skills.
